## Post deployment Records

1. DD 214, each time you are on Federal activation the VA will need a copy of the DD214 for that call up.
2. Sick call slips/ accident reports. These are the most needed forms. These forms will show that you had a medical problem in the service and the treatment given. Where some veterans have had problem is that they went to the Doc but did not want it in their records, like officers and high-ranking NCO's. After they get out and try to get help, they cannot for there are no records of them having a problem in service. If you do not want to have it in your SMR, go to a privet doctor for the help; just have records.
3. Deployment Orders: the orders will help in the claims. While the DD214 shows you were activated, the deployment orders will show where you were sent.
4. Awards Orders, while the awards are on the DD214, with out the orders it does not mean much. This is due to the fact that some veterans have forged their DD214 so as to get service related compensation. Many awards will help a veterans claim.
5. Mission logs/ journals, many in the transportation units travel all over and the only records are those on the CO/BN logs. Work to get a copy and make sure to report any thing that went wrong on your missions.
6. Photos, in country, near enemy equipment, ECT
7. Doctor's reports after you get home on any thing that started while you were on active duty.
